Angeline Haisten Hayes, 89, passed away April 26, 2019, at her home in Atlanta, Georgia, after a courageous battle with cancer.

Born November 19, 1929, in Griffin, Georgia, to the late John Guye and Elizabeth Haisten, she married Marvin Lewis Montgomery on December 19, 1953, and they had three children, John, Luanne and Marilisa. When her husband died while on active duty as a USAF captain stationed in Okinawa in 1965, she returned to Griffin with their children. She married Zach Clark Hayes, III, on January 27, 1972, and they enjoyed many years together in Griffin, Atlanta and Suwanee until his death in 2007. She was also preceded in death by her sister, Claudette Haisten Crandall.

A lifelong Methodist, Angeline was most recently a member of Peachtree Road United Methodist Church and the Blazers Sunday School class. She was also a member of the Cherokee Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.
