June Anne Carletti Sambol, 90, of Alpharetta, GA, and life-long resident of New Rochelle, NY, died Saturday, August 22, 2020 at Sunrise at Ivey Ridge in Alpharetta.

Born in New Rochelle, NY, June 11, 1930, she was a daughter of the late Henry Carletti, Sr. and Gertrude Carino Carletti of Rhodes Street in New Rochelle.

Mrs. Sambol had an undergraduate degree from Hartwick College and a Master's degree in Social Work from Columbia. She was a Psychiatric social worker for the Veterans Administration in the 60's in Pittsburgh. In the 70's she was a traveling social worker for the Visiting Nurse Service of Westchester. She taught Social Work at Iona College in New Rochelle in the 80's and was a volunteer lecturer after hurricane Sandy for the American Red Cross in her retirement.

She was a member of the Holy Family Roman Catholic Church in New Rochelle, NY.

Surviving are a son, Neil Sambol and wife Sarah of Roswell; two grandchildren, Benjamin and Noelle; and a brother, Henry Carletti and wife Deanna of New Rochelle, NY.

Private funeral services will be conducted Tuesday from the Chapel of Haisten McCullough Funeral Home. Private entombment will be in Ferncliff Mausoleum at Ferncliff Cemetery in Hartsdale, NY.

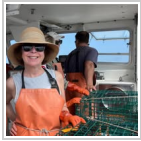
