Mrs. June Ozburn Harris, age 83 of Griffin, passed away Tuesday, January 1st, 2019 at Navicent Healthcare in Macon.

Mrs. Harris was born May 14th, 1935 in Leesburg, Florida to the late Marion Rodgers Ozburn and Martha Williams Ozburn. Mrs. Harris was preceded in death by her husband, Charles L. Harris and granddaughter, Hannah Ozburn Truelove.

Mrs. Harris moved to Griffin at the age of two and spent her remaining years as a resident. She graduated in 1953 from Griffin High School, and went on to work at the University of Georgia Experiment Station, where she met her husband of thirty eight years. She was a member of Union Baptist Church since the early 1960's.

Survivors include her children, Charles Timothy Harris of Cambridge, Massachusetts, Ramona Elizabeth Harris of Gainesville, Georgia and Monica Lauren Harris of Griffin, Georgia. Several nieces and nephews and other family members also survive.
