Marion Richard Musser, 92, passed away Friday, January 21, 2022.

Mr. Musser was born in Tiffin, OH on May 31, 1929. He was a veteran of the U.S. Army and stationed in Alaska during the Korean War. He graduated Summa Cum Laude from Case Institute of Technology with a degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1957. He retired in 1996 from Holan Division of Ohio Brass, where he was a design engineer. He enjoyed woodworking, reading about math, playing cribbage and making dad jokes.

Marion was a member of the First Presbyterian Church in Griffin, GA for 47 years, where he served as deacon and elder.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Max and Dorothy Musser, and stepdad, Leonard Musser; brothers, John and Jimmy Musser, and sister, Nancy Musser.

Survivors include his wife of 63 years, Elsie Musser; brother, Jerry (Diane) Musser; sons, Max Musser, Andy Musser and David (Jackie) Musser; daughter, Susan (Nick) Gawel; grandchildren, Nichole (Tyler) Steele, Brittney Musser (Vance Willbanks), Emily Gawel (Austin Neuberger), Ben Gawel, Samuel Musser (Taylon Hammons), and Shiloh Musser.

We regret that after leaving home, Marion and I weren't as close as brothers should be, due to distances and raising our families. Later in years, Marion wrote the most wonderful letters about his family. Diane and I always looked forward to these letters, which most of the time included cartoon clipping or wise sayings. Marion was quite thrifty as many his letters were written on old memo pads and recycled envelopes. I remember Marion as the brains of the family. He was known to have read all or most of a book while walking home (ignoring traffic) from the library. People came in to our store telling mom about Marion with his head in a book oblivious to the surroundings. He was creative, but his ideas weren't always the best. I remember when he flocked the inside door panels and roof of his 1949/50 black Ford with a bright yellow short fiber material. Riders would end up with yellow dandruff. Mom had her hands full with Marion and Jack. One Christmas eve, they were baby sitting Nancy and me ,but discovered a BB gun under the tree. Nancy and I were locked in the basement as they proceeded to shoot the ornaments off the tree. Diane and I were so pleased that Marion and Elsie came to our wedding in Tucson. Everybody loved them. We also visited Marion and Elsie several times. We miss the Musser reunions. Marion and Jack were always the life of the party. We won't be at Saturday's memorial due to covid19 concerns.
