Pete Randolph Alexander, 61, of Griffin, died Wednesday, May 8, 2024.

Pete Randolph Alexander was born 8/1/62 in Griffin, GA to the late Louis Mark Alexander, Sr and the late Barbara Ann Dickson Alexander. Pete attended Griffin High School where he was the District President of the YMCA; Member of Bogarsun Social and Civic Club; Member of GHS Student Council; Voted Mr. and Mrs. Griffin High School along with his cousin Susan "Sue Sue" Alexander. Pete was the first African American to earn the Eagle Scout award from the Boy Scouts of America in Spaulding County. He also received the Eagle Scout of the month award by the American Legion in 1981.

Pete went on to attend Mercer University where he was a Mercer Ambassador; Sophomore Class President and where he was initiated in the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. His dedication and passion for the fraternity were unwavering throughout his life. As an active member of the Rho Sigma Lambda Chapter in McDonough, GA, Bro. Alexander played a vital role in fostering brotherhood and community engagement. His commitment shone brightly during his service as the RSL Golf Committee Chair for the last 5 years, where he brought enthusiasm, organization, and a sense of camaraderie to every event. Bro Pete Alexander will be remembered for his kindness, leadership, and tireless efforts in upholding the principles of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. His legacy of service and brotherhood will continue to inspire and guide us all. Pete will be deeply missed and fondly remembered by all whose lives he touched.

After College Pete went to work for the Boy Scouts of America where he began as an Entry Level District Executive and worked his way up to Senior Executive. He retired after 24 years where he worked diligently to serve the youth of the Greater Atlanta Area and Washington, D.C.

Pete leaves behind a legacy of dedicated leadership and commitment to community outreach and philanthropy. His role as Director of Community Outreach at Kid's-Doc-On-Wheels Inc. and Board Member at Large was pivotal, shaping the organization's trajectory and establishing its governance structure. Notably, he founded the Kid's-Doc-On-Wheels board and selected Dr. Renee Bazemore as its first chair, laying a strong foundation for future endeavors. Pete's fervent dedication to philanthropy was evident in his efforts to support Kid's-Doc-On-Wheels Inc., initiating fundraising endeavors, establishing the organization's tennis tournament, and cultivating crucial donor relationships. Beyond his professional pursuits, he actively participated in community initiatives such as Gourmet Gents, highlighting his commitment to social causes. His enduring volunteerism with the Metropolitan Atlanta Chapter, Inc National Coalition of 100 Black Women, Inc, Gourmet Gents fundraiser since the late 1990's showcased his unwavering passion for mentorship and community service, leaving a lasting impact on all those he encountered.

Pete accepted Christ at an early age while attending Wolf Creek Count line Missionary Baptist Church where he served faithfully as an Usher alongside of his late mother for many years. Later, he joined North Griffin Community Baptist Church at the Highland where he believed greatly in it's "Community Connect" program.

Pete was preceded in death by his father Louis Mark Alexander, Sr; his mother Barbara Ann Dickson Alexander; his brothers: Gary Alexander and Louis Mark Alexander, Jr. and his wife Lucille Pope Alexander; his sister Margaret Ann Alexander and niece Shirley A. Pope.

He leaves to cherish his brother Dr. Robert Louis Alexander, MD; Niece Amanda Alexander, Nephews: Robert Alexander, Jr, Wille (Bubba) H. Pope Jr

and Reginald (PeeWee) I. Pope Sr; Aunt Alene Miller; his special Lady Friend Jaunessa Jackson; a host of cousins, relatives, and friends.
